**Are you interested in teaching ESOL in the Lifelong Learning Sector and do you work in Train-To-Gain or other workplace provision?**

The School of Education and Training at the University of Greenwich is running a ONE-WEEK intensive programme that leads to ESOL PTLLS accreditation (part of the PGCE/PCE Lifelong Learning Sector).

## What it's about

Preparing to Teach in the Lifelong Learning Sector (PTLLS) is designed to introduce trainers to ESOL teaching. It is for people who are yet to gain the required teaching qualification for the lifelong learning sector, providing a threshold licence to teach and opportunities to develop the skills, knowledge and understanding in planning and enabling ESOL learning.

## What you do

You will study ONE course (Preparing to Teach in the Lifelong Learning Sector: ESOL) where you will:

- Understand your own role, responsibilities and boundaries in relation to teaching ESOL;
- Develop appropriate teaching and learning approaches in ESOL;
- Demonstrate session planning skills for ESOL teaching and learning;
- Understand how to deliver inclusive sessions which motivate learners;
- Understand the use of different assessment methods and the need for record keeping.

## Teaching practice requirements

There is no requirement to undertake teaching practice although an element of demonstrated teaching with directed tasks is built into the course

## Where next?

PTLLS is a six credit qualification at Level 4 which is the first step to a teacher qualification (24 credit CTLLS or 120 credit DTLLS).

## When is the course?

From Monday 20<sup>th</sup> July to Friday 24<sup>th</sup> July. Each day will begin at 10.30a.m. and finish at 4.30p.m. with an hour for lunch. Activities will include individual tasks, paired and small group work with time for reflection at the end of each day.
