If you would like to build your confidence as a teacher trainer and would like an opportunity to reflect on and up-date your practice, or if you are an experienced ESOL/Literacy teacher who is thinking of becoming a teacher trainer, then this course is for you.

- develop skills in planning subject-specific content for teacher training courses
- consider subject-specific issues in teacher education

### What are the entry criteria?

It is open to well qualified ESOL/Literacy teachers and teacher trainers with at least three years experience of teaching within a Skills for Life setting. You will need to attend all three days and be committed to completing the set assignment.

### What does it lead to?

On successful completion of the course (including the assignment) you will receive 20 credits at M Level, and will have the opportunity to progress to a Masters level (Level 7) Postgraduate Certificate, Diploma or Masters in Teacher Education accredited by London South Bank University
