This intensive *Training the Teacher Trainer* course consists of three contact days, tutorial support, and up to 180 self study / blended learning hours. The course covers theory and practice related to the observation and feedback in teacher training. It is open to LLN teacher trainers engaged in observation and feedback in a teacher training context from any region in the country.

Is this course for me?

If you would like to build your confidence as a teacher trainer and would like an opportunity to reflect on and up-date your practice around observation and feedback then this course is for you.

What will I gain from this course?

It will help you to:

- develop your practice as an observer of trainee and trained teachers
- up-date yourself on developments in teacher education
- consider trends and methodologies in teacher education
- critically reflect on theory and practice in teacher education
- meet your annual CPD target

What are the entry criteria?

It is open to teacher trainers with at least 3 years experience of teaching within a Skills for Life setting. You will need to be currently working in a teacher training context and carrying out observations of LLN teachers. You will need to attend all three days and be committed to completing the set assignment

What does it lead to?

On successful completion of the course (including the assignment) you will receive 20 credits at M level, and will have the opportunity to progress to a Masters level (level 7) Postgraduate Certificate, Diploma or Masters in Teacher Education accredited by London South Bank University
